NAVAL OFFICERS THINK THE MAINE WAS DESTROYED BY A SPANISH MINE.

George Frazier Bryson, the Journal's special correspondent at Havana, cables that it is the correct opinion of many Spaniards in the Cuban capital that the Maine was destroyed and 258 of her men killed by means of a submarine mine, or a sunken torpedo. This is the opinion of several American naval authorities. The Spaniards, it is believed, arranged to have the Maine exploded over one of the harbor mines. Wires connected the mine with a powder magazine, and it is thought the explosion was caused by sending an electric current through the wire. If this can be proved, the brutal nature of the Spaniards will be shown by the fact that they wanted to spring the mine just after all the men had retired for the night. The wreckage shown in the picture shows where the mine may have been fixed.
